FAQs

What are the criteria for pastors who are invited into a cohort?

There is not strict criteria for who is invited to participate in a cohort. Healthy cohorts are representative of the diversity of their community and often include ministry leaders from various denominational, theological, and racial/ethnic backgrounds, as well as from a range of pastoral experiences, roles, and ministry callings.

How much does it cost to participate in a cohort?

The three-year program costs The Ministry Collaborative between \$100,000 and \$150,00 per cohort. Thanks to the extraordinary generosity of donors, the entire program is provided to pastors at 1% of their annual salary, per year. This "skin in the game" contribution strengthens the commitment levels of everyone in your cohort. Scholarships are available, and no pastor will be denied participation due to financial hardship.

How is The Ministry Collaborative funded?

Approximately 1/3 of The Ministry Collaborative's funding comes from our founding organization, The Cousins Family Foundation, 1/3 from private donors across the country, and 1/3 from other foundations and endowments, including the Lilly Endowment and The Duke Endowment. We are grateful to our faithful partners who are investing in pastors and congregations. Their generous support gives us a firm foundation on which to expand our ministry across the United States and Scotland.

What about the time commitment? It sounds demanding.

The Ministry Collaborative cohort is not another "to do" on the calendar, but a life-giving discipline of community, encouragement, and accountability. The Ministry Collaborative insists on a high level of commitment from pastors because when this commitment is shared with a group of people over the course of three years, it affords transformative, even life-changing experience. The Ministry Collaborative cohorts meet for between 2.5 and 4 hours once per month. As one pastor in a The Ministry Collaborative cohort recently explained, "I thought it was going to result in a time deficit, but actually, it's been a time-multiplier because of how the group has helped me to be more disciplined in my life and ministry while also providing resources along the way."

When will my cohort start? What's the timeline?

Most cohorts take at least 6 months to assemble. Please make the upcoming orientation gatherings a priority!

What To Expect From The Cohort Experience

At The Ministry Collaborative, our focus isn't on "skilling up" participants. Yes, skills like fundraising, conflict management, and preaching better sermons are important, but we recognize that if pastors are to effectively deploy these skills long-term, they require growth at a deeper level where things like sustainability, adaptivity, and intuition are developed. What does this look like in The Ministry Collaborative cohorts?

Capacity Building

The cohort as a whole and all individuals in it will build capacity for long-term support and guidance for navigating life and ministry.

Developing Adaptivity

We want to help pastors shift from being under the tyranny of the urgent and "putting out fires" into a mode of long-arc leadership that is effective in moving congregations forward into the ways God is calling them.

Nurturing Healthy Leadership

As one The Ministry Collaborative pastor put it, "Simply put, my congregation is healthier because I'm getting healthier. And this is equipping us to contribute to the health of our community." Let's dig deeper into your calling as a minister, as a leader, as a child of God, and let's nurture some deep bonds of friendship along the way.

Broadening Perspectives and Resources

Not only is the cohort itself a sustaining resource of support and development, but the broader The Ministry Collaborative network continues to grow as a diverse community of voices, experiences, ideas, resources, and opportunities to develop healthy, courageous, and creative leaders.

Digging a Deeper Well

There are all sorts of ways for simplifying and going deeper in your ministry context. Let's get at these and put them into practice.
