Topics for exploration will include: leadership as self-discovery, organizational change, the inevitability of conflict, leading a board, leading staff, claiming authority, and accepting responsibility.


Transitioning into a larger leadership role is complex. It frequently requires new skills, habits, and priorities; growth in personal and professional life; and a renewed and necessary focus on one's health and spiritual maturity.

This cohort is designed for two related groups of ministers: (1) pastors who have recently taken on a senior leadership, head of staff, executive, or similar role, as well as (2) pastors who are anticipating a transition into that sort of role, in the near future. The cohort will explore through a variety of avenues - including the wealth of experience from Kelly and Amy – how to expand your capacity for these roles and thrive in them. The cohort will include several quest presenters who can share from experience and, also get into technical and adaptive components of leading larger systems of laypeople, staff, volunteers, and relationships with partnering organizations or denominational bodies.
