The model for vocational ministry is changing. Many of us are already living with the challenges of our changing contexts. The multi-vocational model is quickly becoming the preferred and most common model for all pastoral leadership positions. This cohort is designed to empower and inspire multi-vocational pastors who serve congregations of any size. Members of this cohort will develop deep, rich, and generative relationships that foster resiliency, creativity, and trust. This will be accomplished through peer learnings, professional development, retreats, and immersion experiences, as well as regular check-ins. The multivocational minister's cohort will aim not just at doing the work of congregational and community ministry, but sustaining the whole person.

This cohort will meet in person every other month and virtually in between to sustain relationships and accountability. This pace is deliberate in order to honor existing family and ministry obligations. It will not be a burden but will likely become a time-multiplier because it will sow into the life and well-being of both pastor and person.

Reverend Tyshawn Gardner currently serves as Associate Professor in the Biblical and Religious Studies Department and Director of the Pre-Ministerial Scholars Program at Samford University. Rev. Gardner served as the pastor of Plum Grove Baptist Church in Tuscaloosa, Alabama for 19 years prior to joining the faculty at Samford University. Rev. Gardner received the Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from Stillman College in Tuscaloosa and the Master of Divinity degree (MDiv) from Beeson Divinity School at Samford University, in Birmingham, where the Dean and faculty selected him as the Most Distinguished Student in 2014. He earned the PhD in Christian Preaching from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY., where his research interest was social crisis preaching and prophetic preaching and rhetoric in the African American preaching tradition. Rev. Gardner has a heart for social justice and racial reconciliation and works tirelessly to see unity and love in the community.

Adam Mixon has been preaching and pastoring for over 25 years, serving the Zion Spring Baptist Church, Birmingham Alabama for almost 18 years. He was educated at the University of Cincinnati, Samford University, and Beeson Divinity School. Adam has served several years as the President of the Pastors and Minister's Conference and as Dean of the Educational Congress within the New Era Progressive Baptist State Convention of Alabama, as well as a member of the official staff in the local district association. He has been a preaching peer-group facilitator for the Lilly Group in association with Beeson Divinity School, and currently serves on the faculty. In addition, Adam is a Facilitator for Macedonian Ministry's Birmingham, AL 2 cohort. Adam enjoys serving as a mentor for several programs and doing the work of a community activist.
